Annie Grillo was born on September 24, 1958 in San Francisco, CA. She is survived by her loving husband of forty one years, Greg Grillo, and beautiful daughter Jenna Grillo. Annie lost a thirteen month long battle to a rare form of intestinal cancer.

Annie grew up in San Francisco as a foster child under the care of her "real" parents, Dorothy and Peter Anduha, and moved to Portola, CA to finish out her high school years.

Annie joined the US Navy in 1977 after high school. Her Navy orders took her to the island of Bermuda where she met and married her husband. She spent a total of 6 years in the Navy, where she did everything from working on tugboats to being an administrative assistant to the base Commanding Officer. She was honorably discharged as a Petty Officer 2nd Class Yeoman in 1982.

After the military, Annie moved back to San Francisco and made a life for herself and husband living in the Bay Area for 16 years. Annie worked her adult years primarily as an administrative assistant at various companies in the SF bay area.

Annie found her true calling with the birth of her daughter Jenna. The selfless devotion to her daughter's well-being was immeasurable. She was a perfect combination of loving support and gentle guidance. She was always present in her daughter's life, never missing a tennis match or choir concert, or a single day of walking her to elementary school.

Annie moved to Vancouver, WA where she spent the remaining twenty two years of her life. She worked as a pre-school teacher in the local community for many years and was adored by the kids, their parents and her colleagues. Annie loved the Pacific Northwest, and her weekly walks around Lacamas Lake were among her most cherished activities. She also enjoyed music and was an avid reader, especially of "The Columbian". She was loved by family, friends and neighbors, and her willingness to help others was truly a gift.

Her memory will live on in the Garden of Hope at the Evergreen Memorial Gardens in Vancouver, WA.
