She was raised in Vancouver, WA and lived here most of her life. Bobbie was a loving, enthusiastic soul who spread joy and laughter all around; whether at home, bridge club, Bible study, leading Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts or Campfire girls, volunteering in classrooms, hosting fantastic parties, or later, in the hospital, convalescent center and care home. She attended the University of Washington and, during WWII, taught school at Washington Elementary and Bagley Downs. Bobbie loved to dance and met the love of her life, Victor, at the USO during WWII. They were married on March 22, 1943 and remained together for almost 67 years until her passing on February 13, 2010. Bobbie was a wonderful, loving mother to David, Victoria (Michael) Riggan and Valerie (Scott Jackson); grandma to five; GGMA to seven; daughter, sister, aunt and second mother to many of her children's friends. Bobbie's wit and flair made everyone feel at ease and every occasion more enjoyable.
