Beverly Ann McCullough passed away peacefully on the morning of August 18, 2025, in Vancouver, Washington, following complications from a fall. She was 80 years old.

Beverly was known throughout her life for her strength, independence, and deep devotion to those she loved.

She was preceded in death by her beloved daughter, Pamela Sue Skelly—whom she lovingly referred to as her “baby girl” until her own passing. Beverly passed on the exact date of the 19th anniversary of Pamela’s death. She was also preceded in death by her father, Joseph T. McCullough III; her mother, Bessie McCullough; and her sisters, Kathryne Louise McCullough and Susan Jeanne (McCullough) Erceg.

She is survived by her brother, Joseph T. McCullough IV; her sister, Jacquelyn Andrews; her cherished grandchildren, Matthew and Lucas Skelly; and many loving nieces, nephews, and extended family members.

A private family gathering will be held at Evergreen Memorial Gardens in Vancouver to honor her life.
