Brad William Studer, 53, passed away unexpectedly at his home on August 17, 2025, in Vancouver, Washington. Born on May 21, 1972, in the same city he proudly called home throughout his life, Brad leaves behind a legacy filled with warmth, humor, and generosity.

A graduate of the Washington School for the Deaf, Brad's education laid the groundwork for a resilient and connected life. He went on to build a dedicated career with the United States Postal Service before retiring. He later worked for Amazon where he was known for his reliability and strong work ethic. Brad will always be remembered as a true friend, a bringer of joy, and a man with a big and kind heart.
