



## Bruce Delano Mullins

Bruce Mullins was born on December 1, 1936 in Lucasville, Ohio but spent most of his teenage years in Hillman, Michigan till joining the Navy. He was the 5th child born to Reuben Mullins and Lula Sexton. He has one surviving sister, Eleanor of Ottway, Ohio. Growing up he was very active in the local 4H and loved hunting in the woods of Michigan. He enlisted in the Navy after turning 20 where he met his wife Gail Sullivan while his ship was in town during a transfer from Hawaii. They had a quick courtship and were married three months later on December 26th, 1959. He spent 10 years in the Navy and was honorably discharged in 1967. They moved from Virginia after leaving the Navy to come out here to Vancouver, WA where they were able to raise their family. He found a job at the Camas Papermill quickly and was employed for 32 years and retired to spend more time with his family. During his working years he enjoyed spending time with his family coaching baseball and softball while being actively involved in Columbia Little League Board of Directors and umpiring. He loved riding his motorcycle and belonged to a Christian motorcycle group for many years and was able to travel with the members. Bruce was also very involved in a local bowling team with his wife for over 20 years and was recently reconnected to a team with some friends in these last few years. He loved to travel around the northwest discovering new adventures and local sites in his motorhome. Bruce decided after a year of retirement he would join the workforce again at the Battle Ground bus barn where he spent 5 years driving before transferring to ESD 112 for another 5

years and had his second and final retirement. After 54 years of marriage he is survived by his loving wife Gail Mullins, along with their two daughters, Renee Moss, Robyn (Peter) Demaray, and one son Bruce (Carmen) Mullins Jr. Over the last 28 years he has been able to enjoy watching his eleven grandchildren and one great grandson grow.
