



## Burgess Monroe Kaylor

August 28, 1924 - November 12, 2016

Burgess M. Kaylor was born August 28th, 1924 in Cleveland TN Passed at home in Camas WA November 12th, 2016. He was 92. His parents were Jesse & Georgie Kaylor of Cleveland TN. He was 1 of 7 children He married Geneva Swift Kaylor "The love of his life" in 1942. They eventually had 4 children. Burgess served in the US Navy from 1943-1945 during World War II on the USS Sylvania as an electrician and mechanic. Burgess was a jack of all trades: He worked in the coal mines of West Virginia, Electrician, Mechanic. He could fix anything and created/invented his own welder and worked on his lathe in which he created many different tools. Burgess worked as a machinist for Tidlands in Camas WA for 35 years. He retired in 1989. He was part of The Church of God out of Cleveland TN, East Gate Church of Camas WA and the Fern Prairie Model Airplane Club. He enjoyed flying his model airplanes with his sons and his grandson, playing guitar and singing, teaching Sunday School, traveling and camping in his motorhome, he loved when the family all got together (his house was called the Kaylor Gymnasium). He is survived by his daughter Judy White of Camas, son Garry Kaylor of Vancouver, brother Lillard Kaylor of Cleveland TN, Barbara Jo Greminger of Cleveland TN, 5 grandchildren, 12 great grandchildren and 7 great great grandchildren.
