CLAUDE CLARENCE KINCAID October 3, 1914 ~ April 7, 2012 Claude Clarence Kincaid, 97, a former resident of Baker City, OR, passed away peacefully in Vancouver, WA on April 7, 2012. He was born on Oct. 3, 1914 in Yakima, WA to Fred and Clara Kincaid and resided in Eastern Washington until coming to Vancouver in 1936. Claude married Annetta Miller on May 28, 1938 and they spent many happy years together until her death in 1982. He married Elizabeth Galt in 1988 and they enjoyed traveling together, spending the winter months in Arizona with friends, before settling down in their Vancouver home. Claude served in the European Theatre during WW II and joined the U.S. Forest Service on the Malheur Forest in John Day in 1947, transferred to the Wallowa-Whitman Forest in Baker City in 1961, and to the Gifford Pinchot Forest in 1969, before retiring in 1974. Claude enjoyed the outdoors, hunting and fishing when time allowed. He was a member of the Elks Lodge, American Legion, and was Commodore of the Vancouver Yacht Club in 1973. Claude is survived by his wife, Elizabeth; son Jerrel Kincaid and his wife, Mary of Baker City; daughter Lynnette Halverson and her husband, Dean of Bend, OR; three grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; three step-children; four step-grandchildren; one step-great-grandchild; and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents; and his brother, Ray Kincaid. The graveside service will be held at Evergreen Memorial Gardens in Vancouver at 10:30 a.m. on April 16th
