Clifford Hauff April 29, 1928 - January 2, 2011 Cliff Hauff of Vancouver, WA passed away peacefully Jan 2, 2011 at the age of 82. He was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota on April 29, 1928. His wife, Edna Hauff preceded his death in July 1998. Raising his family, Cliff lived in Vancouver the majority of his life and worked on the waterfront as a Longshoreman belonging to both ILWU Local 4 and as a Walking Boss in Local 92 for 44 years until he retired in October 1990. Cliff was a life member of the Eagles, Elks and Moose Lodges.
