Clive Neff Duncan April 1, 1924 to February 22, 2013 Neff Duncan died peacefully, surrounded by his family, at the age of 88 from an aortic aneurysm. He was born in Fremont, Utah to Mary E. Neaf and Densmore Duncan. He grew up in Washougal and attended Washougal High School. Neff met the love of his life, Ruth Sanderson, while working at the Kaiser shipyards. They married on Sept. 2, 1942 and had three daughters: Penny, Peggy and Terry. Neff joined the Army in 1943, and drove a tank in WWII and the Korean War. In June 1947 he changed to the Army Air Corps, which became the US Air Force. While in the military he was a recruiter, Drill Sergeant, and a mechanical repairer on ground power. He retired after 22 years, returned to Vancouver and went into the service station business. He and Ruth operated one of the first hydroponic tomato farms in the northwest. He was very active in the Grange (Master and life member), Masons (Past Master of Ridgefield Masonic Lodge), Order of Eastern Star (Past Patron), Shriners and Scottish Rite. These activities and his church were a huge part of his life. Neff lived life to the fullest and spread goodness wherever he went. He loved sports and camping, cherishing the many years he spent watching his grandkids play on various teams, and going on outings with the NCT camping group "Big Foot". Neff was preceded in death by his beloved wife of 58 years Ruth, second wife Jeanne, and special friend & loving companion Donna Ladwig. He is survived by his daughters Penny (Bob) Norvell, Peggy (Bill) David, and Terry (Paul) Nylund, his two brothers Garth Duncan of California, and Robert Duncan of
