She was a great gardener, tending a large family garden on their property in Brush Prairie. Debi had originally worked as an Engineering Technician in the City Surveyor's office, and had an excellent understanding of property records, Rights of Way, and later, the city water system records. I admired her dedication to keeping good records for upgrades and improvements, & notes on the record set of water system drawings. She had an amazing sense of where to look to research old property/system information. She knew it was important as the water system has to be learned and maintained by successive generations of operations workers, and she wanted them to have good records. Also, our office was near the Columbia River, and someone had dropped off a couple peacocks to fend for themselves, occupying the office parking lot and treatment plant grounds for several weeks. She finally caught them and took them home, giving us regular updates.
