After returning home from the Navy, it was at church where he first met his wife Dixie. They quickly fell in love, married and started a family. With young kids in tow, he made sure most weekends were filled with trips to the library, playing in the park, swimming at the YMCA and visits to Grandma's house. His sunny disposition meant that even rainy days were fun-filled for everyone around him. After retirement, Don remained active in musical choirs as well as tending his renowned vegetable garden. He also enjoyed his time at the gym where he worked out with friends into his 80's and right up to the last months of his life. Galatians 5:22-23 tells us that the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness and self control. To everyone who knew him, this is a perfect

depiction of Don. He was sure of his final destination and at peace with the end of his journey, leaning on God's promise to see him home to Glory.
