She was born in Seaside, OR on Sept. 14, 1915 to Walter and Emma Marsh. Dorothy moved to Vancouver in 1922 and graduated from Vancouver High School in 1934. She was a longtime member of Emmanuel Baptist Church and was a former member and past Noble Grand of Oneonta Rebekah Lodge. "Dorothy lived for her family and found great joy in surrounding herself with them. There was no better wife and mother. She was a talented seamstress, making everything from custom swimsuits, lingerie, furniture upholstery, men's suits and the wonderful quilts she made for her children and grandchildren."
