Edmund G. "Ed" Tolon, 57, died Friday, March 1, 2013, after losing a brave battle with cancer. Ed was born on January 22, 1956, in Deer Lodge, Montana to Richard "Moose" and Lois Tolon. He graduated from high school in Helena, Montana and then joined the Air Force, serving four years as an Airlift Bombardment Aircraft Specialist, at McChord AFB, Washington. Ed ran several marathons and looked forward to times when he could ride his Harley and ride in many charity events. Ed is survived by his loving wife of 30 years, Brenda, and their two sons, Eric and his wife Heather, and Cory of Vancouver; son, Destine and two grandsons of Anaconda, MT; his mother, Lois Tolon of Deer Lodge, MT; his four brothers: Tim of Deer Lodge, Tom of Colorado Springs, CO, Dan and his wife Teri of O'Katie, SC, Mike and his wife Lesley of Helena, MT; and two sisters: Luanne and husband Dan Antila of Elliston, MT, and Terese Penix of Huntsville, AL; and numerous nieces and nephews.
