



Edward Michael Wolf, Jr.

March 5, 1924 - October 13, 2020

Born March 5, 1924 in Dover, Oregon to Edward M. Wolf, Sr. and Katie S. Kehres Wolf. He was the sixth of nine children, having 3 brothers and 5 sisters.

Ed's family moved from Dover to Sandy, Oregon when he was five years old. His grandfather and his father logged land and grew Christmas trees. Ed played quarterback (#33) for Sandy High School football team, and entered the Navy in March 1941 at the age of 17. He served as a motor machinist for six years. After basic training his ship the "USS Oglethorpe" deployed to the South Pacific. On 12-6-1941 the ship was headed to San Francisco, and ordered back on 12-7-1941 to return to Pearl Harbor. Settling in Sandy, Oregon he married Elizabeth (Betty) Outlaw in 1948. He became an instant father to 3 children he adopted, Marie, Jim and Carol loving them as his own. Rhonda was born from this union. Ed grew strawberries on his land while working for Reynolds. Many Wolf family members still reside in Sandy.

He retired from Reynolds Metal after 30 years as a machine operator. After Betty's death in 1980 he married Shirley Harding in 1982. He added four step children to the family: Glenn Harding, Ken Harding (Nancy), Shirlene Buckmiller (Ron) and Jillene Short (Dan). His passion was Golf. Always wanted to be better every game and could quote bible verses chapter after chapter. He knew the Bible well and treated everyone with Love. He leaves

behind 4 children Carol Williams (Dwayne), Rhonda Wilcox (Tom), Ken Harding (Nancy) and Jillene Short (Dan). Ed is survived by his sister, Ada Rich (100 years old) and his loving 12 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren and many great-great grandchildren. When people would comment on what a good Dad he was, Ed would say its because of Jesus, if you center everything on Jesus you can do it all.
