Estella Arlene (Mallory) Biasi, 90, passed away on April 28, 2019 in Vancouver, Washington. She was a resident at Touchmark at Fairway Village.

Arlene was born in Radium, Colorado, on July 15, 1928. Her father, Loren Mallory, was a laborer, farmer, and carpenter. The family moved frequently throughout the west for his work, and Arlene joined her older brother, Lyle Mallory, in San Diego in 1945. There she met the love of her life, Robert John Biasi, a sailor from Dubuque, Iowa. They were married on June 19, 1946. Their first son, Dennis, was born in California in 1947, followed by Robert Lyle, Gary, and Chad, born in Dubuque after Bob's discharge from the Navy.

Arlene and Bob found a wonderful retirement community in Fairway Village in Vancouver. Both were excellent golfers and hosts, and will be remembered for fun gatherings in their home. They were active in Village events and traveled frequently to visit family in the Midwest until they moved to Touchmark in 2014. Bob passed away in December 2016.

Arlene is survived by sons Dennis (Nancy), Robert L. (Rosemary), Gary (Elaine), and Chad (Jean); sister Sherry Brown; 12 grandchildren, and 16 great-grandchildren. A family reunion and memorial will be held in Dubuque, Iowa, where she will join her beloved husband.
