



Floyd Lorence Haffner

February 29, 1932 - January 24, 2023

Floyd was born in Kulm, North Dakota, a small farming community to Alvin and Pauline Haffner. The family moved to Buhl, Idaho when he was a small child. He graduated from Buhl High School in 1951 where he was a star athlete. In 1953 he was drafted into the Army and served at Ft. Campbell, Kentucky with various units as an Airborne Infantryman (paratrooper).

In 1957 he married LaVaun, a widow with two children. In 1959 they moved to Vancouver, where he purchased a share at Ft. Vancouver Plywood and served as a shift foreman for several years. In 1971 he purchased a share at Linnton Plywood, retiring in 1994. In retirement they lived in Woodland, WA on the banks of North Fork of the Lewis River where he caught many fish and loved to share them with friends and family. He took great pride in taking care of his home and parklike setting. Floyd was very social, enjoying friends, family, neighbors, playing cards, dancing and his coffee guys. He lived his life in a manner that was a sterling example of how to be a decent human being.

His biggest love was his wife, LaVaun whom he took care of to the very end.

He peacefully passed away on January 24, 2023 after a short bout with pancreatic cancer.
