“ The holidays bring so much joy, but there is also sadness at times. Keith was not only a choir director, but was my first professional choral mentor. Along with his other talents he was instrumental in the founding of The Peanut Gallery Musical Theater Company (named for the First show we produced, "You're a Good Man Charlie Brown", in 1972, when I played CB. This theater group remained very active in Vancouver for many years, doing quality musical theatre, in great part due to Keith and his wife Carolyn. Keith introduced me and my fellow singers to the new school choir genre of "Swing Choir" in 1967 and when new tunes were hard to come by he transcribed/arranged pieces for our group. I still remember performing his transcription of the 5th Dimension's "Aquarius/Let The Sunshine" at either the inaugural or 2nd Mt. Hood Swing Choir Festival in 1968. We rocked...thanks to Keith. He had a positive impact on many, many students and community members. He was a fine man, and even 50 years after our first interaction at the old Fort Vancouver High School School in 1967, we remained friends. Rest In Peace, Keith. To paraphrase "Lucy Can Pelt"... You're a Good Man, Keith Neubauer. Love ya. CB
