With all this he still found time to visit his family in Idaho. When in the service he always took his leave to help his parents Opal and Bud Walling with the farm, and of course his kids

loved coming to Grandma and Grandpa's farm. A lot of pot luck dinners and everyone getting together, when he came home.

Glen is survived by his sons Bob Perry, Richard Perry both in Vancouver, and Randy Perry in Woodland Washington, 4 grandsons Robert , Mario Glen and Keven. Granddaughters Heather and Myra. Sister Mary Margaret Hageman of New Plymouth Idaho. numerous nieces and nephews and some great nieces and nephews and a few great great nieces and nephews.
