



Glenn Eugene Schrock

August 9, 1935 - July 1, 2021

Glenn Eugene Schrock was born in Fairbury, Nebraska on August 9, 1935, to Harvey & Hazel Schrock.

In 1939 his family moved from Nebraska to California, finally settling in Chico. Glenn graduated from Chico high school in 1954. That same year he made his choice to serve God. That commitment greatly enriched the rest of his life. After high school, Glenn began working in the lumber industry. The family relocated to Red Bluff in 1958. Glenn continued his occupation until drafted into the US Army. He attended basic training at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. From there he was sent to Landstuhl, Germany with the 46th Surgical Medical Field Hospital, until his honorable discharge in 1960. He developed many lifelong friendships with his professing army buddies, along with families and workers he had fellowship with during that time.

In September of 1960, Glenn met Jean Tyson at Boring, Oregon convention. They were married on June 9, 1961. Glenn started his Postal Service career in April 1961 as a mail dispatcher; then as a window clerk. They made their home in Red Bluff where their children were born, daughter Natalie in 1963 and son Bryan in 1966. They were privileged to have a meeting in their home for 39 years. Glenn retired from the postal service in June, 1996.

In June of 2016, Glenn & Jean moved to Vancouver, WA. to be closer to family where they enjoyed watching their great grandchildren grow. In

December 2020 they moved to Highgate Senior living. Due to Glenn's declining health, he was moved into memory care in June 2021. While in memory care they celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary. Glenn passed from time into eternity on July 1, 2021. Glenn is survived by his sister Bonnie Vandenburg & husband Jan, wife Jean, daughter Natalie Wiesenberger & husband Greg, son Bryan & wife Cindy, two grandchildren, Shawna Barttelt & husband Larry, Tyler Schrock & wife Annie, 4 great grandchildren Jackson, Eleanor & Rowen Barttelt, & Kallie Schrock. Also, nephews, nieces, extended family & many dear friends.
