HARVEY RAY HALL, JR. July 3, 1919 ~ Dec. 20, 2009 Harvey Ray Hall, Jr. of Vancouver, WA, passed away on Dec. 20, 2009. He was born in Terre Haute, IN to Harvey Ray Hall, Sr. and Mary Hazel Hall. Ray Sr. and Hazel came to call their son, Skeet, as in mosquito. He was always buzzing around. Soon, the Halls moved to Louisville, KY. One of Ray's favorite stories was that when he was a youngster, he went to the Kentucky Derby by climbing over one of the tracks walls and watched the race. The next town Ray lived in was Elkhart, IN. There he met Winifred Glase. They became good friends. This turned into an eternal relationship of love as they ultimately married in 1941 following Ray's graduation from Purdue University with a degree in chemical engineering and from his commissioning as a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. Army. After traveling and participating in WW II in Australia and the Philippines with the fighting quartermaster corps, Ray came home to Elkhart and then Kalamazoo, MI. Ray and Winifred had two children, Bruce and Nancy. Ray worked for Allied Paper Co. In 1957, the Halls moved to Wilmington, NC when Ray worked for Riegle Paper Co., then back to Kalamazoo to Allied in 1958. In 1963, the family moved to Vancouver, WA. Ray became the assistant resident manager of the Boise Cascade Paper Mill. Ray and Winifred moved to Lake Oswego when Ray worked for Publisher Paper Co. and Pennwalt. Ray retired to his hobbies of golf and the stock market and moved to Fairway Village and made even more friends. When Winifred passed away in 2003, Ray eventually moved to The Waterford. He had been active in the Vancouver

Rotary and was a member of the Purdue Alumni Association. He was a member of the Columbian Presbyterian Church. Ray leaves his son, Bruce (Marilyn); his daughter, Nancy (Charles) Anderson; three grandchildren, Benjamin Hall, Margaret Lowry, and Sam Anderson; and two great-grandchildren, Abigail and Lucy Lowry.
