



## Jane L. Floyd

June 27, 1947 - July 29, 2009

Jane Floyd, died of natural causes at her home in Vancouver, WA on July 29, 2009. She was 62. Ms. Floyd was born in Bend, OR to Gilbert and Madeline Moty. She was the youngest of three daughters. The family later moved to Klamath Falls, OR where Jane graduated from Sacred Heart High School. Jane attended St. Mary's College at Notre Dame in Indiana for two years and received her Bachelor's of Education from the University of Portland. She later earned a Master's of Library Science from Portland State University. In 1971, Jane married Ronald Floyd. He preceded her in death in June 2008. Ms. Floyd worked in elementary schools in Vancouver for 27 years, first at St. Joseph's and then Sarah J. Anderson, Hough, Harney, Lieser, McLoughlin, and Hazel Dell schools. During that time she was a teacher, librarian, and math facilitator. She also served two terms as president of the Vancouver Education Association. While in Vancouver, Jane was a member and Chair of the City of Vancouver Planning Commission and on a panel studying the feasibility of light rail. In 1998, after her retirement, Jane and Ron moved to Port Angeles. She continued to volunteer, working for the Port Angeles Education Foundation and the Friends of the Fine Arts Center. Jane loved to travel, play bridge, try fine wines, cook and entertain. She also loved spending time with her family and her many friends. Survivors include her father, Gilbert Moty; sister, Anne Hartnett, both of Klamath Falls, OR; four nephews, James and Michael Hoffman of Oregon City, OR, Drew Hartnett of Klamath Falls, and Gill Hartnett of Salina, Kansas; and one niece, Sarah Johnson of Terre Haute,

Indiana. A memorial Mass at St. Joseph Church, 400 South Andresen, Vancouver, WA, is scheduled for Monday, August 31, 2009 at 11:00 a.m. The Mass will be followed by a reception in the parish hall.
