



Jerry Tucker Goldsmith

March 27, 1940 - May 4, 2023

Jerry Tucker Goldsmith, age 83, of Vancouver, WA, passed away on May 4th, 2023. He was born in Venice, CA. Jerry married Margaret in 2001, in Brush Prairie, WA. He retired in 2001 from SeaWorld as a Vice President and Corporate Curator of Exhibits. He is survived by his wife Margaret, sister Sharon, sister Stacey, son Ken, stepdaughter Julie, stepson David, stepdaughter Janis, 12 grandchildren, and 12 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents Elsie and James, his first wife Jeanne and his daughter Julie.

His family will be hosting a memorial service for Jerry on July 15th at Daybreak Park, from 11am to 1pm in Battle Ground, WA.

Jerry Goldsmith's Story:

Jerry was born March 27, 1940, in Venice, CA to James William Goldsmith and Elsie Jean Mandamaker. He was the oldest with two sisters, Sharon and Stacey. Jerry married Jeanne Louise Koski on June 10, 1963. They left for Alabama 10 days later for his tour in the Army. When they returned in 1965, they lived in Palos Verdes, CA. Their daughter Julie was born in 1971 and their son Ken was born in 1972. After 37 years of marriage, Jerry lost Jeanne, to cancer in 2000.

As a Marine Biologist, Jerry worked for Marineland of the Pacific for 20 years. He later worked for Sea World and moved his family to Escondido, CA. He worked at Sea World for over 20 years. Some of his highlights at work were

helping design the Coral Reef Exhibit, the Penguin Encounter, the walk-through Shark Tank and Discovery Cove in Florida. When he retired, he was a Vice President and Corporate Curator of Exhibits.

In 2001, Jerry married Maggie Ranieri. When he retired, he followed his lifelong dream to live in the desert. He designed the house that they lived in Borrego Springs, CA. The property included a casita for their guests and they enjoyed sharing the desert with their friends and family. In the hot months they traveled up to the Northwest to escape the heat and spend time with family. In 2011 they moved to Vancouver, WA., Maggie's hometown and where many of their family resided.

Jerry enjoyed telling funny stories and jokes and making people laugh. He was a great artist and cherished many art pieces that his friends and acquaintances made. He liked to draw comics of his friends and family, and many found them quite entertaining, even though they were not always appropriate. He enjoyed his time and the knowledge he gained about fish during his time at SeaWorld as well as the desert life he experienced searching for lizards and snakes of all kinds while living in Borrego Springs.

“ If it was not for Jerry Goldsmith, I have no idea where I'd be today. In 1969 I was living in Redondo Beach, going to school, working in a paint store, and being a recreation leader, hoping not to get drafted. In my free time, I built an aquarium in my uncle's woodshop and made a slurp gun to collect some local fish. I learned that Marineland sold filtered seawater for ten cents a gallon, so I went to Marineland, found the back gate, and asked if I could buy some seawater. The person I was talking to was Jerry. He asked me what I wanted it for, and we started talking. He asked me if I would like to do this kind of work at Marineland. I said something stupid like, " You mean I would get paid to do what I love?" He said yes, but first, I would have to interview with John Prescott, and if John thought I was OK, then I'd have a job. Somehow John gave the OK and I got the job! Jerry was a great mentor and a wonderful friend. It was an incredible time to work with Jerry at Marineland. Jerry for a time lived with Ken Norris when Ken was at Marineland. I couldn't get enough of the stories Jerry would tell about Ken and his collecting trips to San Blas for sawfish. It was no surprise to me that he named his son Ken.

When I left Marineland and continued on, Jerry was always there to support me and give advice. I had long before begun working with mammals, which Jerry only tolerated. Over the years, Jerry visited Point Defiance Zoo and Aquarium multiple times, and we so appreciated his visits and whatever he had to share with us. One time we got to stay in the house he designed in Borrego Springs; that was a piece of art. So many stories over so many years; what an incredible loving guy Jerry was. I was at SeaWorld Orlando when Vivian was in a terrifying accident in San Diego. Jerry arranged for me to be flown back immediately. And, without hesitation picked up Vivian's Mother and took her to the hospital. He waited at the hospital until I arrived and he knew everything would be okay.

Jerry may have been an artist but he did not know or understand the color wheel. While building the tropical reef at SeaWorld San Antonio he went through 20 gallons of latex paint trying to color match the artificial corals or create a new dazzling color. I found him not happy and swearing at the paint...each of his attempts ended in dirty baby diaper colors...no matter which colors he used.

During our time building SeaWorld San Antonio we all learned to NEVER let Jerry drive us anywhere...stealing his keys was a game.

Jerry and I always talked about pumping up the volume of color in a coral reef to counter the diatoms that muted the colors. His favorite refrain: Make the Easter Bunny jealous!

I would take Jerry out otter trawling in Mission Bay and longlining for batrays off of Point Loma. We were hauling in a longline off of Point Loma when he repeatedly and in an urgent voice asked if there should be that much water in the boat. He was more of a dry land/beachcomber sort of aquarist.

Jerry was in Orlando, Florida working on an Aquarium project when he approached me for help. He was a bit worked up. He was flying back home the next day and needed something more than jeans and a work shirt for his impending nuptials. I piled Jerry into my truck and took him to a men's store. I had to keep him from buying an outfit that the Easter Bunny would have been jealous of.

Jerry was true and great fun.
