Without warning, Julie suffered a massive stroke sometime during the overnight hours of Sept. 5 to the 6. She was rushed to ER, but never recovered. It was determined she was brain-dead. She was kept on life support only long enough to safely harvest her organs for donation.

Julie was born in Portland, OR, to Robert and Marcia-Lee Wolfard, and graduated from Lake Oswego High in 1983, then from Southern Oregon College in 1987. In 1989, she began working at WINCO Foods where she stayed for 32 years, finishing her career there in the pricing department.

Her first marriage went poorly, but 1993 did produce a son for her, Jared, who is now a terrific guy with a huge heart and extraordinary moral standards.

She met the love of her life, Andy, in 1996, and they were married in 1999.

Andy legally adopted Jared soon thereafter.

She and Andy were always, always going somewhere: New York, Jamaica, Maine, Europe, the Caribbean, or best of all ... on a cruise. She also loved camping - yes, tent camping. Many who knew Julie find that surprising, but Julie could go from six star, to one star in a blink ... as long as she knew another six-star trip was coming up soon!

She also loved Jazzercise, and the many, many great friends she made there.

She is survived by her "Annie-Girl"; son, Jared; husband, Andy; four sisters, and one brother.
