Kenneth "Ken" Hogan, 93, of Vancouver, Washington, passed peacefully on November 13, 2025.

Ken was born in Muscatine, Iowa, to Matthew Hogan and Sarah "Lydia" Smith. From a young age he learned the value of responsibility, compassion, and hard work—qualities that would define his entire life.

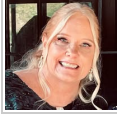
