



## Lois W. Harry

April 3, 1925 - July 28, 2023

Lois W. Campbell Harry, 98, of Battle Ground, passed away on July 28, 2023. Lois was born April 3, 1925 in Vancouver, Washington, as the sixth of seven children of Carrie and Ernest Campbell, and was a life-long resident of Clark County. In the fall of 1937, as a 7th grader, Lois attended Orchards Grade School and met her future husband, Elmer Harry. Lois and Elmer subsequently attended Shumway Junior High and Vancouver High School and graduated as school friends in 1943. Lois worked at Vancouver High School for several years providing clerical support and later attended Willamette University in Salem, Oregon. She reconnected with Elmer following his military service during WWII and later married on August 6, 1948, enjoying a loving relationship of almost 68 years when Elmer passed away. Lois is survived by, Kathy, David, Steven, and Lee. Daughters Nancy and Susan passed away in 2014 and 2022. Also surviving are many grandchildren, great grandchildren and a few great-great grandchildren.

Lois was a devoted and supportive mother and grandmother whose priority was always her family. In addition, Lois was the family archivist-the go-to person who remembered significant dates for all family events and birthdays. Lois was also a passionate listener and collector of musical recordings (including 78's, 45's, LPs, and later CDs) with an amazing recall and ability to play nearly any recording on request.

Lois and Elmer spent their retirement years traveling in the U.S. visiting national parks and the homes of their children and extended families. When

they lived near Yacolt, Lois rekindled her enjoyment of bicycle riding while also making good use of her Clark County library card and the associated mail-based book-lending service. Lois and Elmer spent their final 25 years together as Battle Ground residents. Lois will be fondly remembered and greatly missed, and yet we know she felt very lucky to have enjoyed her many deep and rich family connections.
