Loris Eda Shearer, or Lori, passed away at Glenwood Place Senior Living on November 11 at 2:42 AM, at age 84. Lori was predeceased by her husband, Roy Edward Shearer; brother, Tom Loree; mother, Lois Loree; and father, Dr. David R. Loree. Lori is lovingly remembered by her daughter, Tina Amundson of Vancouver; son, Tim Shearer; sister, Marcia Wessitch of Vancouver; 3 granddaughters; and one grandson; 6 nieces; and 1 nephew. Lori was born in Portland, OR on April 11, 1932. She graduated from Vancouver High School in 1950 and went on to earn a Bachelor in Science degree in nursing from Lewis and Clark College in 1955. Lori practiced nursing in Princeton, NJ until along with Roy, traveled to Korea to participate in missionary work for 10 years. Lori retired in 1992 as the church organist at First Presbyterian Church after 20 years of service. She was also the office manager for Roy's psychology practice, the Presbyterian Counseling Service. Lori was active in the music program at First Presbyterian Church and East Woods Presbyterian Church for many years, starting in 1979. She participated in the church choir, bell choir, played for many weddings and memorial services, recitals, and special music programs. She played and sang for the church services at Glenwood Place until Alzheimer's made it difficult for her to continue. Lori enjoyed reading mystery novels, Macrame', working on puzzles, needlepoint, sketching, putting together photo albums, cooking, traveling, chocolate, and most of all leading those around her in song. The memorial service will be

held at First Presbyterian Church, 4300 Main Street, on November 22, at 1:00 with Pastor Josh Rowley officiating.
