She was a charter member of the Prince of Peace Lutheran Church.

After the farm upkeep became too much, she moved to a condo which she really enjoyed. Next stop was 8 years at the Van Mall Retirement Center where she made many new friends. She enjoyed playing bingo, cards and watching movies with them. When her health started to decline, she moved to Highland Adult Care Home where she spent the last two years of her life. Her caregivers, Alex, Roxy and Katie were wonderful ladies who gave her great care and were especially kind to her. The Kaiser Hospice team, nurses Heather and Mary Kay were wonderfully kind and compassionate during her last days. Chaplin Todd was there as well to give her words of comfort.
