Marvin Dee Bare, 61, of Vancouver, WA, passed away on January 29, 2023. Marvin was born on January 4, 1962 to Archie and Patricia Bare in Vancouver, WA. The youngest of 4 children, he was "the baby" but became a pillar in the family.

Marvin graduated from Evergreen High School in 1980, he went on to enlist in the United States Navy Aviation where he served 4 years but he made the choice to be closer to family. Following his time in the Navy Marvin began working at Betts Spring Company as a shop mechanic, kickstarting a 35 year career with Betts.

field as both a player and cheerleader. He also found joy in traveling and warm beaches abroad. Often happiest with a bahama-mama in his hand and "his lady" by his side.

His proudest achievement remains his children. He was a dad first and wore his cargo shorts and sandals with pride. Enjoyed dunking each of his children off the boat tube. A master of squeeze hugs. Marvin was the protector of the family and provided a calm and kind listening ear.

Marvin was a source of strength for everyone that entered his orbit. He put family first and created fond memories with his loved ones, especially a lifelong friendship with his sister Janice. Even for those that were not blood related, he soon became their "Uncle Marv". He had an uncanny ability to make anyone he talked to feel like they were best of buddies.
