Milton Florian Webb was born September 1930 in Biloxi, MS to Dorothy and Florian Webb. The family, including his younger brother Stanley, lived in Ocean Springs, MS before he met his future wife, Barbara, at a church camp.

Milton joined the Coast Guard in October 1949 and soon after he and Barbara were married. After a short stay in the south, he and his family were transferred to Vancouver, WA.

While Milton grew in knowledge and rank, so did his family. The Coast Guard took him to many ports of call in his 20 years of service, but upon his retirement he returned to Vancouver and began his 17-year career in the maintenance department at the newly constructed Frito Lay plant.
