



Myron Lee Lewis

March 1, 1925 - January 6, 2011

Myron was born March 1, 1925 in Burke, SD. He and his family moved to Vancouver, WA in 1936. He joined the war effort in 1943 by enlisting in the Navy upon graduation from Union High. He survived hazardous submarine duty in the Pacific & shared many of those memories with family and friends. He was a radio tech on the subs which led to his Ham Radio hobby in the post war years. Myron had many hobbies but some of his favorites were flying radio-controlled model airplanes, flying stunt kites at Long Beach, WA and gold panning. Myron married a high school classmate Dorotha Mae Haagen in 1946 and they had 57 blessed years together. In the early years he earned his living at the Dubois sawmill, Alcoa and Bennett Paper. During that time he & Dorotha worked their 20 acre turkey and chicken ranch while raising six children. In 1971, he opened Myron Lewis Real Estate (Our Action is Your Key) which grew to 6 offices and over 50 agents. He eventually developed the 20 acre farm into a 49-home residential area called Lewis Addition. Upon retirement, he and Dorotha traveled all over the U.S. and the world several times before her passing in 2003. In his sunset years, Myron married Bettyjo Wilcoxon and in her found an angel to dance with for 6 and half years. He is survived by his wife, Bettyjo Wilcoxon Lewis, sister Myrna Wegner, half brothers Marlyn (Berniece) Lewis and Marvene (Barbara) Lewis, daughters Connie (Steve) Ivie, Vickie (Michael) Johnson, Sharon (Brent) Newton, sons Gordon Lewis, Arnold (Linda) Lewis, Rodger (Lorie) Lewis, 21 grandchildren and 22 great grandchildren.
