Peter Jodenschwager, 83, of Battle Ground, Washington, passed away on October 3, 2025, after courageously living with Parkinson's disease for over two decades.

Peter is also survived by his mother in Berlin, who is 103 years old, along with extended family in Germany. Peter had a zest for life and a remarkable spirit.
