Whether still picture or moving, it didn't matter as long as he was behind a camera when something was going on. His other hobbies were hunting, fishing, and camping. But, most of all, he loved God and his family. He served God as he sang and played his guitar up until his last days. He was

always there for his family and friends. He gave of himself whenever and whatever was needed. He always told us "I pray for you all the time", and he did.
