Surrounded by family and friends, Sue Soule, 68, of Vancouver, WA, ended her long and courageous battle with lung cancer to be with her Lord Jesus on Jan. 7, 2010. A perfect day for her was having a house full of family or a sunny day spent at Cannon Beach. Sue was a devote Christian and attended several Full Gospel congregations over the years. She volunteered in homeless kitchens and gave of her time unselfishly to those in need. She will be remembered as always having a glow from the Hawaiian sun she loved so

much. Sue is survived by her loving husband of 34 years, Ron Soule; her sister, Georgia Johnson of Camas, WA; her daughter, Kim DeMent of Lake Oswego, OR; her son, Deryk DeMent of Portland, OR; and many grandchildren, nieces and nephews.
