Mr. Terrence G. Popravak, 83, passed away at home in Vancouver, WA on Wednesday, September 7, 2026 after several months of illness. He was born in Chicago, Illinois on March

25, 1942, the second of two sons of Nicholas L. Popravak and Jane Popravak, nee Danielewicz.

Terry carried a jovial heart that lifted the spirits of everyone around him, giving of himself tirelessly and without hesitation to support others.

Terry attended Chicago Vocational School where he graduated in the class of 1960. He then

joined the Illinois Air National Guard and served with his older brother Nicholas in the 217th

Ground Electronics Engineering Installation Agency (GEEIA) Squadron from 1960 to 1966.

Terry married the love of his life, Helen M. Casey, in Gulfport, Mississippi on October 25,

1960 and they started a family. Father of seven children born between 1961 and 1980, Terry

moved through the world with a soul on fire - a light so genuine that anyone who crossed his path felt instantly lifted.

Terry was a faithful parishioner at St. Joseph's and attended mass until this recent illness

caused him to worship our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ from home.

Terry worked hard to support and provide for his family, including but not limited to the

steel mills, telephone company and TWA Airlines before he became a Patrolman in the Chicago

Police Department's Third District in 1967. He moved his family to Vancouver in 1972 and the

city's Police Department, but was shot in the line of duty in late 1973 and medically retired.

Terry then worked police radio dispatch, and in 1976 became an original member of the new

combined 911 service in Clark Regional Communications Agency.

In 2001 he joined the city's Parks & Recreation Department at the Marshall Center, then

moved over to the Public Works Department and the section which maintained the street signs

all around the city until his retirement a few years later.

Terry studied at Clark College, then composed his memoir of police service in Chicago titled

"Grand Crossing," an unpublished work now being transcribed by family members for

publication.

He is survived by his children, Terrence G. Popravak, Jr., Dawn M. Figlioli, Daniel P. Popravak,

Erik J. Popravak, Nicholas A. Popravak and Michael J. Popravak, nine grandchildren and five

great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, brother, his wife Helen and daughter Colleen.
