Theodore Lloyd Werner passed away Saturday, Feb. 6, 2021, in Camas, WA. He was born Aug. 16, 1930, in Bloomington, IL, to parents William and Ivy Werner. He and his family moved to Washington in the mid 1940's. He attended Battle Ground High School, graduating in 1949. In June 1951, he married Lillian Bair, who he had met on the school bus and promptly told his friend, "I'm going to marry that girl someday!" He proudly served his country in the U.S. Air Force and Air Force Reserves during the Korean War.
