William F Brosam, 79, passed away in Vancouver, WA on January 6, 2017. He was born on May 17, 1937 in Spokane, WA. He attended Sacred Heart School in Spokane through the 10th grade. One month after his 17th birthday, Bill enlisted in the US Marine Corps. Bill is survived by three children: Theodore Brosam of Butte, MT; Mark Brosam and Tammy Dietz both of Spokane, WA. Also survived by Grandchildren and great-grandchildren and three sisters, Carole Deeble, Donna Miler and Debbie Hubenthal all of Spokane, WA. In June of 1970 Bill completed 8000 hours of apprenticeship and became a Certified Journeyman Carpenter. Employed by many general contractors in both Washington and Oregon. In his prime, Bill was active in dart teams and bowling leagues. He enjoyed NASCAR races and Sci-Fi movies on TV. He was a member of the VFW, BPOE and the Moose Lodge. In addition, he had a special love for his toy poodle, Tiger. In 1972 Bill married Beverly, but they were later divorced. This was not the end of their story, in 1989 he re-entered her life and they were married again in 1992, until his passing. Later in life, Bill had several strokes and then he started on a long, sad journey of Progressive Dementia which caused him to be severely frustrated.
