He approached hobbies with scientific rigor and intellectual curiosity, even managing to grow and witness the blooming of a rare plant. In the US, Xiubo continued to grow beautiful plants wherever he stayed, and instilled beautiful values of love and kindness into his grandchildren. He enjoyed multi-hour long walks all across towns and cities well into his 80's, spanning from the East to West coast of the US, and across many areas of Canada as well. His many

stories from his daily walks give solace to the family, as his memories remain strong and fond for all of us. Xiubo lived his life as one of the kindest and most benevolent people. Time after time, he put his own interests below that of others, and spent his whole life helping those in need with all his heart. He exuded kindness, and brought happiness and warmth to everyone he met throughout his life; if there are angels in this world, he is sure to be one of them. Xiubo was loved by all, and especially cherished by family. His lessons of kindness and gratitude would be remembered through his family, his many flourishing plants cared for by grandmother and family too. He raised 3 kind daughters, and lovingly helped the growth of 5 wonderful grandchildren. Xiubo left many warm moments and happy memories to the family.
